Child: "Child" means any person from birth to eighteen (18) years of age. To protect children whose physical, mental, or emotional well-being is threatened by the actions or omissions of parents, legal guardians or custodians, or persons responsible for providing out-of-home care, including a foster parent, an employee of a residential child care facility and a provider of family child care or center-based child care. The county shall provide services targeted to achieve the following: children are secure and protected from harm; children have stable, permanent and nurturing living environments; and, when appropriate, children experience family continuity and community connectedness. Services are also provided for families that are enrolled in the Child Welfare Special Circumstance Program.

Adult: An at-risk adult is any person age eighteen (18) or over who is susceptible to abuse, exploitation, or neglect because the individual is unable to perform or obtain services necessary for the individual's health, safety, or welfare, or lacks sufficient understanding or capacity to make or communicate responsible decisions concerning the individual's person or affairs. The Adult Protective Services Program is designed to intervene with or on behalf
