Colorado Adoption Month Key Messages

Updated November 2024

- Foster families provide the safety, stability and care that children and youth need while their parents take time to learn new skills and address safety concerns.
- Whenever possible, caseworkers try to ensure the safety of the child(ren) in their own home by connecting parents and caregivers with support and services.
- On average, 8 kids enter foster care each day in Colorado. Kids in foster care are like every other kid you know. Each one is unique with their own needs, hopes and dreams.
- Foster care is temporary but the impact foster families have on a child and their biological family is forever.
- Children are resilient. Even when they've experienced adverse childhood experiences, such as abuse or neglect, they can overcome and reach their full potential with support from a dedicated foster parent.

November marks the beginning of National Adoption Month in Colorado. Every November the Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) recognizes four exceptional adoptive families from across the state and encourages more Coloradans to consider adoption from foster care.

The primary goal of foster care is to reunify children with their parents. However, if that option is not available, adoption or another type of permanency is the secondary goal. There are xx kids in foster care in xx County waiting to be adopted today. Many of the kids waiting to be adopted are teens.

WHEREAS, affirming, supportive parents can help a child or youth overcome past traumatic experiences and reach their full potential; and

We need your help to find families for children and youth in Colorado

Today in Colorado, there are 369 children and youth in foster care who are waiting to be adopted. (To customize, use your community name and number waiting). These children are resilient. Even though they have experienced abuse or neglect, they can overcome and reach their full potential with help and support from the community and a loving parent.

We need everyone in Colorado to help us find a parent for these kids. Here's how:

1. Become a foster or adoptive parent. Since last January alone, 379 children and youth (to customize, use the number in your community) in foster care were adopted, most frequently by their foster parents. Family reunification is the primary goal of foster care. When that isn't possible, we look for an adoptive family to provide the love, stability and safety that every child needs and deserves.

Visit CO4Kids.org to learn more about becoming a foster and adoptive parent. You don't have to be perfect to be a perfect parent. You must be at least 21 and be ready to make a difference in a child or youth's life at a time when they need you the most.

It does not matter if a parent is older or young, has never been a parent or is an experienced parent.


